4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Note the TWOT (Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament) number – in the example below, the <b>TWOT number</b> is 698a and 699a</li> </ul> <p>from 2616 , Greek 964 βηθεσδα TWOT-698a, 699a; n m</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Note the word to the left of 'Pronunciation' – this is the <b>transliteration</b> of the Greek word</li> </ul> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p><b>χαρις</b> [Find in MultiLex] [Find in Greek Lexical Parser]  <b>Strong's Number: 5485</b>  <b>Pronunciation: charis</b> thar'-ece</p> </div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In the example above, the transliterated word is 'charis'</li> </ul>
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go to the Stamps Library reference collection and look up your <b>TWOT number(s)</b> – the call number for the <i>Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament</i> is: <b>Theo Ref BS 440 .T49</b></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go to the Stamps Library reference collection and look up the transliterated word in the index of the <i>Theological Dictionary of the New Testament, Abridged in One Volume</i> (<b>Theo Ref BS 2312 .K58213 1985</b>) – do NOT confuse the abridged volume with the 10-volume set that is next to it on the shelf</li> <li>• Go to the page number listed in the index for a short article on your term</li> </ul>

**NOTE:** It might be helpful to use the **Expository Dictionary of Bible Words** (Theology Ref BS440 .R525 1985) with this assignment.
